Why Coordinate?


- Why are we doing all this work?

Why are we doing all this work?


Don't ask WHY – ask FOR WHOM!


#10: Get to know your TEAM

- As the Lead, try to bring out the best of each person/entity




#9: Always try to work as a TEAM.

#6: A little 'thank you' goes a long way!


• Say THANK YOU – spare time is nonexistent, so any help, no matter how small, should be greatly appreciated


#5: All schedules will rarely coincide.

• You must be willing to accept change.




#3: Think BIG!
